Disruption Free Learning



Any student who disrupts learning will be **moved** within the classroom. Their name will be written on the **MOVE** board.

A student who disrupts learning again will be **REMOVED** and will be collected by a member of senior staff and escorted to Reflection.

Parents/carers will always be contacted when a student is removed from a lesson.

- Students who are REMOVED will remain in Reflection until the same lesson the next day and until an hour after their scheduled finish time on the day of their removal
- Students who are placed in Reflection must hand over their mobile phone on entry

Mobile Phones



Mobile phones are banned from being used at any point on the academy's site, whether indoors or outdoors.

We operate a 'See it, Hear it, Lose it' policy with regard to mobile phones. This simply means that a mobile phone will be confiscated if it is seen or heard on the academy's grounds.

This policy applies to all students in Years 7 to 11.

Make sure your child correctly dressed every day. More information about uniform expectations will be given later in this presentation.




Correct PE kit can be worn on days when you have PE on your timetable.

1:1 Devices to support Learning

Improved digital literacy is a whole school strategy to capitalise on the positive outcomes of online delivery in the past 12 months, helping students to develop future skills and bringing transformative approaches to teaching and learning.







Each student will be provided with a Chromebook for use in school and at home at some point in the first week of school.

Assessment and Academic Performance

- During Year 7 students' first 6 days (from Monday 4th September) they will have the following assessments:
 - MidYis (Cognitive Ability) Tests
 - NGRT and NGST (Reading and Spelling Tests)
- In the September, students will be tested in the following subjects:
 - English
 - Mathematics
- Year 7 students will initially be set in English, Maths and Science using the KS2 Reading and Maths scaled scores.
- Our internal assessments will allow us to baseline the students accurately and will allow us to modify the teaching sets English, mathematics and science from Monday 25th September.

All homework is recorded on Satchel:One (Show My Homework)






- Homework is expected to be completed whenever set.
- Please take an active interest in your child's homework. As a parent you have a role to play in ensuring that students recognize the value in working independently at home this will help to unlock their true potential.
- Failure to complete homework will result in a 50 minute same day detention.

- EVERY student has their own individual homework login that can be accessed on an APP.
- Up to 2 parents/carers can view the homework of every child in their family through an APP or online.

Accelerated Reader

All students in Year 7 take part in the *Accelerated Reader* programme.

The programme is designed to **improve reading ages** and comprehension skills. Most importantly, the programme is designed to foster a passion for reading.

All students read books appropriate to their current reading age. KBA library is full of *Accelerated Reader* books.

Every Year 7 student is allocated 20 minutes **DEAR (Drop Everything And Read)** time during the school day. Students are also expected to read for at least 20 minutes independently or to a parent/guardian.

Once students have completed reading a book, they must then take the *AR* quiz that accompanies the book. This is a comprehension style quiz and the score they achieve moves them closer to their target.

Students are assessed every term to monitor their reading progress.



Bedrock

Bedrock Vocabulary is an online programme that teaches young people the **academic words** they need to succeed at school and beyond, while encouraging reading, boosting literacy, and improving learning outcomes across the curriculum.

Bedrock is **self marking** and **adapts to each learner**, making it easy for your child to use **independently**. However, you're a very important part of our community – research shows that when parents or guardians are engaged with their child's learning, they make more progress.

Bedrock enables you to **track their progress** and see which words they're learning, giving you the opportunity to use them in family conversations.

Bedrock will send you an **email each week** with information on your child's learning and progress. You can log into your **parent dashboard** at any time to see which words your child is learning and how they're getting on.



- The password can then be changed to something memorable



Curriculum

In Year 7 students will have 31 lessons per week. They will study:

- English and Maths 5 lessons
- Science 4 lessons
- Geography, History, MFL 3 lessons
- PE 3 lessons*
- Music, Art, Design Technology, Drama, RE 1 lesson
- National RSE curriculum in form time



During form time students will access our ICT and Computing curriculum and some students may do extra Literacy or Numeracy lessons.

*Students will study Food Technology for 6 weeks as part of our curriculum offer linking Design Technology with sport and nutrition.



Arbor Application – Parent Portal

- Arbor Parent Portal provides parents with live information regarding behaviour, attendance and academic performance
- All **academic reports** issued for students are stored electronically and are accessible at any time via the Arbor Parent Portal.
- As all reports are shared with parents via the Arbor Parent Portal, it is important that we are provided with your email address in order to facilitate this.
- Parents with more than 1 child at the school can view **all** their children's information on Arbor Parent Portal at once

Who are Arbor?

Your child's school has chosen Arbor as their MIS provider. An MIS is a system that helps schools collect, store, manage and use all the information they need. Arbor is a simple, smart and cloud-based MIS, meaning the data isn't physically stored in school, making Arbor super secure as computer theft or damage at the school would not lead to data loss or a data breach. It also means you can log into Arbor to see and update your child's information or make payments and bookings yourself!

Arbor was founded in 2011 by a small group of people on a mission to create a simple, smart MIS system that would help schools learn from their data to save teachers time and ultimately improve student outcomes.

How can parents use Arbor?

Here's how you can use Arbor:

- Log into Parent Portal for Google Chrome on computers or laptops
- Download the Arbor App from the App Store or Google Play Store then log in on your phone (For Android 5.0 or iOS 10.0 and upwards)
- Your school can then send you In-app messages. Your school can also send you emails, letters or SMS from their Arbor system.
